Prof. Ana M. Gimeno

Ana M. Gimeno is Full Professor of English Language in the Department of Applied Linguistics at the Universitat Politècnica de València (UPV), Spain, where she started her teaching and research career in 1985. She has held various managerial positions at UPV. She has published numerous research papers on language learning and teaching, more specifically in the fields of English for Specific Purposes (ESP), Computer-Assisted Language Learning (CALL), and Content and language Integrated Learning (CLIL).

Since 2022, her research interests focus on exploring new ways of integrating Generative Artificial Intelligence to enhance foreign language learning. Prof. Gimeno is Head of the CAMILLE Research Group, devoted to research in CALL and e-Learning. She has been Project Manager of several funded multimedia CALL research and development projects that have led to the publication of a number of language courses in digital format. Through *Proyecto InGenio*, funded by UPV, she has created an online dedicated CALL authoring tool and content manager to enable the publication of interactive courseware for foreign language learning on the web.

In 2016, she co-authored the first Spanish as a foreign language Massive Open Online Courses (MOOCs) delivered on the US-based edX platform, which have attracted over 500000 learners from around the world. These MOOCs are listed on Class Central's Best Online Courses of All Time ranking (2020) and on the 100 Most Popular Online Courses of All Time ranking (2020). In 2018 she published the first upper-intermediate English edX MOOC, which has attracted over 350000 learners worldwide.

Prof. Gimeno is Associate Editor of *ReCALL* (Q1 journal published by Cambridge University Press) and serves on the Editorial Board of *Computer-Assisted Language Learning Journal* (Q1 journal published by Taylor and Francis), as well as being editor-in-chief of *The EUROCALL Review*. She was President of the European Association for Computer-Assisted Language Learning (EUROCALL) for 6 years (2005-2011) and is currently President of the world organisation for computer-assisted language learning, WorldCALL (www.worldcall.org).
